We are currently receiving deliveries of the City's newest buses, which include 16 60-foot diesel Novas and 27 40-foot diesel New Flyers. While both bus builds are arriving simultaneously, their contracts were awarded at different times. As a result, these buses include several new features that differ between the two builds. These upgrades are intended to make the bus safer and more reliable, while also improving the overall experience for both our operators and our passengers.

The Nova bus build includes:

- Ricon "Ouick Change Windows"
 - New heat-resistant glazing that keeps the interior cooler
 - Significantly easier to replace
- Super Single on B-Axle
 - Unique feature utilizes a super-single tire
 - Improves fuel efficiency and reduces operational costs
- Optional 3-point Driver Seat Belt
 - Lap belt contains a tab that will allow the optional shoulder belt to attach to it
 - Increases safety for the operators

The New Flyer bus build includes:

- USSC "Semi-Active" Driver Seats
 - Reduces injuries and fatigue; adjusts to bumps and vibrations to reduce physical impact
 - Tested on Bus 880 in February 2023
 - 3-point belt securement
- Mobileye with Shield+
 - Warns of potential hazards in front, to the side, and in blind spots behind the A-pillars

Both bus builds include:

- · Arow Driver Barrier
- A robust security door designed to deter driver attacks; installed and tested on BUS 189 in 2021
- Vianova Infotainment System
 - Displays upcoming stops with estimated arrival times
 - Can be utilized for various rider information and notifications
- Rear-Facing Cameras
- An addition to the existing security system
- Improves rear-end collision visibility and doubles as a reverse camera
- Footage is displayed on the dashboard's multi-function display
- New Voith Transmission
- Promises improved performance and fuel efficiency while maintaining the high level of reliability for which they are known for
- Gears were significantly increased from four to seven

2024-2028 Equal Employment Opportunity Program (EEOP)

Under Federal Transit Laws, The Federal Transit Authority is responsible for ensuring that its recipients do not engage in employment discrimination:

A person may not be excluded from participating in, denied a benefit, or discriminate against under, a project, program, or activity receiving financial assistance under this chapter because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability or age. (49 U.S. C. § 5332 (b))

At OTS our EEOP is updated every four (4) years or when major changes occur in the workforce or employment condition. This new program dates run from July 1, 2024-June 30, 2028. It serves as a guide to further our mission and goals to improve our practices and efforts to allow our workforce to achieve their full potential and provide the best transportation service to our customers.

EEO POLICY STATEMENT

On September 1, 2024, a new signed Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) policy statement was also issued. Not only does our policy statement identify all of the Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 groups, but it also includes the additional categories the State of Hawaii has identified as protected areas such as veteran status, domestic violence or sexual violence victim status, marital status, arrest and court record, reproductive health decision, breastfeeding, credit history, or national guard participation.

ALL SUPERVISORS SHARE IN THE SUCCESS OF THE EEOP

The Civil Rights Office is responsible for the EEOP, however all OTS executives, management, and supervisory personnel share the responsibility for implementing and monitoring the EEOP to ensure compliance is achieved. All applicants and employees are expected to be treated with dignity and respect, as well as equitably under the guidelines of our EEOP.

OTS is well represented across all categories of minority employees. While we have made some progress in increasing the number women working overall in public transit, they remain slightly underrepresented. Over the past decade, there has been only a small percentage increase in the number of females, as detailed in the utilization analysis section of the EEOP.

The EEOP is available for you to review on apps.thebus.org under "Policies." When you click on the "Policy Menu" page, choose "Personnel Policy" and then click on the EEOP. You can also find it on our intranet: select "Policies," then "Personnel" and click on the EEOP.

EEO material and our EEO policy statement can be found on bulletin boards near time clocks, in employee breakrooms, and in the new hire onboarding material. Our public website Careers at TheBus and TheHandi-Van have a link to the EEO Policy Statement in English and many other languages as well as Oahu Transit Service, Inc., is an Equal Employment Opportunity Employer.




Photo above: Equal Employment Opportunity Program Plan Cover.

Roadmap to Rail

Over the past year, we have made numerous service changes to improve our network. Many routes have been realigned to connect passengers to the new rail line stations, and other adjustments have been made to reflect the changes in ridership patterns. The second opening phase of rail is just around the corner. Adjustments have been made in anticipation of the line reaching the Middle Street Station, and far more will be done when it opens.

Examples of the changes in preparation for the second phase of rail opening are Route 200 (which looks like "zoo" at first glance), Route 20, and Route 7. Route 200 now takes passengers out of Palolo valley and down to Waikiki, to the Honolulu zoo and around Kapiolani Park. The park segment was previously served by Route 20. Route 20 will be restructured and renamed to Express Route W when rail opens at Middle Street. This route will start at the airport and only make six (6) stops as it runs down Nimitz to Waikiki with very high frequency. The park segment of Route 20 does not require the frequency that Route W will provide, the segment was a great frequency match for Route 200. Similarly, Route 7, which is a combination of Route 7 and Route 9 now offers a one-seat ride from Kalihi Valley (mauka/

makai) to connect to the Kalihi Rail Station and continue down the coast to downtown, Ala Moana and Kahala Mall. The Pearl Harbor segment of Route 9 was eliminated having other available service from the Kalihi Transit Center.

Our next focus will be redesigning the circulator routes in Kapolei. Not many changes have been made in the area for a while. New attractions have developed in the area along with the need for further improved rail station connections. We will be soliciting your input about these route improvements and informing you of changes as we go. You can look forward to the same process as we approach the opening of the second segment of the rail line.

Everyone has done a fantastic job providing input and keeping our passengers informed. All members of the team from operators and maintenance to information and accounting have done a great job of supporting these changes. Mahalo, you are truly driven with the Spirit of Aloha. We look forward to the next big step and will keep you abreast of the upcoming changes.

Driver Shortages

Driver shortages are occurring nationwide, including truck and school bus drivers. The American Trucking Association (ATA) reports a shortage of roughly 60,000 drivers. That number is expected to grow by the end of the year, and this school year has been no exception. Fewer bus drivers have forced the Hawaii Department of Education to cancel bus services for thousands of public school students. This leads me to believe that our public transit system will work harder to accommodate the students. Ridership numbers have climbed in the past couple of weeks, and since the start of August, we have seen a slight ridership bump of about 5,000 new riders.

Here at Oahu Transit Services, we have been dealing with driver shortages for years. Driver retention is also a major concern, and 20 percent of our workforce is at retirement age. We have been continuously hiring new operators, with four classes a year, and are trying a different approach to the hiring process. We have always had a training program that offers new hire employees the opportunity to acquire their Commercial Driver's License (CDL) through a rigorous 2-week CDL training program. We have now implemented a CDL permit class where potential students may voluntarily attend on the weekends. Our goal is to reach out to these students and hopefully get a bigger pool of qualified operators in the new hire training program.

To combat our driver shortages, we created duties with longer workdays, interlining and integrating more routes between divisions, which makes fewer duties, and unfortunately, we have to bring in operators on their days off. We have had numerous conversations with our mainland

peer agencies, experiencing the same driver shortage problems. They have provided valuable insights and advice on programs that work and those that do not. We look forward to exploring these options in an effort to attract and retain operators.

We recognize the sacrifices all our operators make, and we want to personally thank them for their continued support from working on their days off, completing extras and trippers, and putting in lots of long hours behind the wheel. Our riders also appreciate caring drivers committed to their jobs and the community. Your time and effort to provide safe, efficient, dependable public transportation hasn't gone unnoticed, and I appreciate every one of you.

At OTS, we take pride in offering some of the best benefits available. Fully paid medical and dental family plans are rare in today's workplace, and we are fortunate to have access to these and more. However, I must admit that I don't always take full advantage of all the benefits offered, and I suspect I'm not alone. So as we work toward a healthier 2025, here are my ABC's for making the most of our benefits.

Awareness: The first step is knowing all the benefits available to you. For union members, the following benefits are managed through the Teamsters Health & Welfare Trust Fund.

- Medical: University Health Alliance (UHA Plan 600) or Kaiser Permanente Plan
- Dental: Hawaii Dental Service (HDS) or Hawaii Medical Services Association (HMSA)
- · Vision: Vision Service Plan (VSP)
- · Chiropractic: ChiroPlan Hawaii, Inc.

To be eligible for these benefits, you must have at least 87 hours of pay (work time, paid vacation, or paid sick leave) each month. If you are unable to meet this requirement, your coverage may continue for up to three additional months with approved leave under FMLA, HFLL, worker's compensation, or TDI. If you will be on an extended leave, plan ahead with Human Resources (HR) to ensure maximum coverage.

Build a benefit plan that works for you and your family. In addition to selecting the right medical and dental plans, you may also purchase supplemental plans. These include voluntary term or whole life insurance, long-term care, short-term disability, critical illness, or accident plans. To view your current benefits, log in to Dayforce, click on "Benefits," and select "Current Elections." Your earning statements (paystubs) will also display your supplemental benefits under the "Post-Tax Deductions" section. Open enrollment is typically in July for changes effective October, so watch for emails and posted notices from Jay Tamashiro for details.

Commit to making use of all your annual benefits including your two free dental cleanings and preventive health screenings. Connect with your team of healthcare professionals and create a network of friends, family, and coworkers who will support your healthy choices. 
